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FOREWORD

I CONSIDER HORMOZ SHARIAT to be the Billy Graham of Iran.

He is far and away the most watched and most influential Iranian evangelist in the world, and his story is well worth reading.

In his day, Billy Graham preached the Gospel of Jesus Christ clearly and unequivocally in stadiums all over the world. Sometimes 40,000 or 50,000 or even 100,000 people or more would come each night to hear Dr. Graham speak the truths of God's Word. Yet the most widely listened-to and fruitful evangelist in the history of the world was never able to travel into Iran to preach the message of eternal salvation, because to do so was (and is) utterly illegal.

But now God has opened an extraordinary door. Twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week, and 365 days a year, Hormoz Shariat and his Iran Alive Ministries colleagues broadcast satellite television programs in Farsi (the language of the Iranian people), sharing the Gospel, teaching in-depth Bible studies, and taking live phone calls from Muslims, who call at great personal risk. These Muslims are so desperate to know if Jesus is God, and so hungry to have their souls and bodies healed by Him, that they are willing to make the call even though they know they could be discovered by the secret police, arrested, tortured, and even killed for showing interest in Christianity.

Because Hormoz and his team are broadcasting programs unlike anything on Iranian state-run television, millions of Iranians are watching every day. They watch in the privacy of their homes, hungry for the truth and grateful for men and women willing to speak the truth in love.

Hormoz's satellite network also broadcasts Christian worship services into Iran, right over the heads of the ayatollahs and the

mullahs and the Iranian intelligence services. Many secret believers in Iran are too scared to go to a church, fearing that the secret police might catch them. Many Muslim converts are too scared to play Christian music in their homes or sing too loudly, fearing that their neighbors might hear them. For some of them, the church services that Hormoz's network broadcasts are the only times of worship and fellowship they have. And for Muslims who are curious about Christianity, such services give them a safe window into a spiritual world of hope to which they feel increasingly drawn.

I had the joy of meeting Hormoz nearly fifteen years ago. He had become interested in my novels and in my first non-fiction book, *Epicenter*, in which I explained a number of Bible prophecies and shared my conviction that the Lord will, one day, draw millions upon millions of Jews and Muslims into the Kingdom of Christ by the power of His Holy Spirit. For some reason, Hormoz graciously invited me to visit him in a secure, undisclosed location. I gratefully accepted his offer, and am so glad I did.

For me, a Jewish follower of Jesus, it was incredibly moving to meet such a remarkable Iranian follower of Christ and his family and his staff. It was amazing to see how God was using them to reach the nation of Iran, the people they love so dearly, with the life-changing message of the Gospel.

Most remarkable to me was to learn that Hormoz did not grow up in a Christian home, hoping to be an evangelist. To the contrary, he was an Iranian-born Shia Muslim. His wife was an American-born convert to Islam who had come to Iran for work. The two met in Tehran. That's where they were married. In 1979, they were members of the Iranian Revolution, marching with millions of other Iranians in Tehran's streets, shouting, "Death to America! Death to the Shah!" And then, as you'll read, they thought, *Well, maybe not Death to America quite yet. We'd like to go to graduate school over there.*

What follows is an extraordinary and truly miraculous journey. This is the story of how God led Hormoz and Donnell Shariat from Iran to America, from Shia Islam to faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, from students of the Quran to teachers of the Bible, from people with no background in media production to pioneers in Gospel satellite television. What's more, this is the story of two lost and broken people (a couple whose marriage was in the process of blowing up), whom God not only saved and healed but called to become leaders of a worldwide movement of Muslims turning to Christ.

I am humbled to call Hormoz and Donnell my friends. They have welcomed me into their home. They have introduced me to their family and friends and staff and board members. We have prayed together. We have studied the Scriptures together. We have spoken at conferences together. I've appeared on their network several times, teaching the Bible and answering questions on live broadcasts. My wife, Lynn, and I have even had the honor of hosting Hormoz in Jerusalem, Israel, on his first foray into the Holy Land, where he shared his story at an Epicenter Conference organized by The Joshua Fund, a ministry we established several years ago.

For years, I have been urging Hormoz to write a book that would share his story in detail, and to explain the vision that the Lord has given him for the salvation of the Muslim world—particularly the transformation of Iran from the world's most dangerous terrorist state to a nation in love with Jesus. Finally, Hormoz has come to his senses and done what I've been asking for so long!

The book you hold in your hands is not only worth reading; it's worth sharing with others. Don't simply read it. Write about it. Talk about it. Discuss it on social media. Absorb its message and pass it on to others.

More people need to understand how much God loves the world's 1.6 billion Muslims. More people need to learn about the work of Iran Alive Ministries and the power of Gospel satellite television. And far more people need to be involved in praying for

(and financially investing in) the effort to reach every Iranian and all Muslims with the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

I sincerely hope that this book, *Iran's Great Awakening*, will be used by God to educate and mobilize a far larger movement of Christians to love the Muslim people, and to more deeply appreciate God's great power to seek and save the lost.

I must confess that Hormoz is driving me to jealousy me because (so far) so many more Muslims than Jews are coming to faith in Christ. Indeed, more Muslims have come to Christ in the past fifty years than during the previous fourteen centuries. As a Jewish follower of Jesus, and citizen of the State of Israel, I certainly believe the words of the Apostle Paul in Romans 11:26. I have no doubt that one day, "All Israel will be saved." Right now, I see a great awakening underway in Iran, and not yet in Israel. But that's another reason I love Hormoz and the book he has written. Because God has taught him lessons that my colleagues and I need to learn as we work to reach our people and seek God for an Israeli awakening.

There is one other reason I believe this book is important: its emphasis on biblical prophecy. Sadly, most Christians don't study prophecy. Yet 27 percent of the Bible, more than one in four verses, is prophetic. Most Christians ignore these Scriptures because they feel they are too complicated or controversial. That's a profound mistake. Every verse of Scripture is inspired by God and useful to us. There are important things about the future of specific nations that God urgently wants us to know. That's why He gave us these prophecies. And woe to us if we ignore them and thus are unprepared when dramatic events eventually come to pass. We will all give an account to the Lord one day. Knowing this, do we really want to have paid scant attention to one-quarter of what God is telling us in His Word? To have failed to live in light of the critical truths contained in these passages?

In this book, Hormoz explains the biblical prophecies about Iran. He explores the passage in Jeremiah 49 that explains how God will judge the leaders of Elam (Iran) and then move His throne there. He also addresses the prophecies found in Ezekiel, chapters 38 and 39, in which God (in the “last days”) vows to judge an alliance of nations seeking to attack Israel, an alliance partly led by a nation known as Persia.

What exactly do these passages say? What do they mean? And how should they motivate us to live differently for Christ? Some authors and Bible teachers might shy away from such matters. Not my friend Hormoz. To the contrary, he deals with them head-on, with courage and candor. For this I love him all the more.

May the Lord bless you for picking up this book and reading it thoroughly and digesting it carefully. May the Lord bless you even more for letting the Holy Spirit ignite a passion inside you to reach every Iranian, indeed every Muslim, with the message of Jesus.

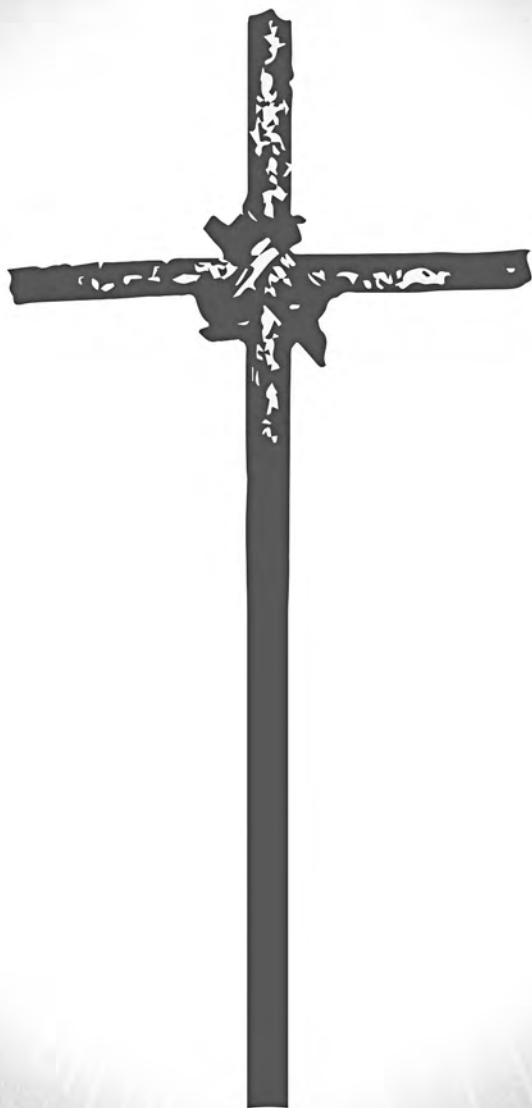

CHAPTER 1

“DEATH TO THE SHAH, DEATH TO AMERICA”

I WAS BORN into a Muslim family in Tehran, Iran in 1955. My grandfather had been an Islamic religious leader. He passed away when my dad was just a kid.

Today, in the city of Semnan, there is a mosque that was built and dedicated to Islam by my grandfather’s grandfather in 1826. Called Sultan’s Mosque, it stands as the oldest and most prominent mosque in the region.

My grandfather (who lived from 1865 to 1920) served as the mosque’s custodian for much of his life, and he also directed the upkeep of other buildings and lands in the area.

After my grandfather died, his nephew assumed those responsibilities. In fact, that mosque, along with assorted other schools, buildings, and lands, were under the care of someone from my family until the 1970s. (After the Islamic revolution of 1978-1979, the mosque was taken over by the new government and renamed Imam’s Mosque, but was also referred to as Khomeini’s Mosque.)

My parents were educators. My dad was a high school principal, and my Mom was a teacher. They were Muslims, but they never forced their faith on me. I remember my Mom always telling me, “Don’t be a bigot or closed-minded. Never accept or reject anything before you study and understand it.”

I held on to Islamic beliefs and practiced them until I was twelve. At that time, I started thinking, “What effect do these practices, such as fasting and ritual prayers, have on me?” I did not (and still don’t) like repeating things mindlessly if they do not add to my life. I had been following these rituals, but they were doing nothing for me. They did not change me or affect my relationships.

I wondered, *Where is God?* These rituals were certainly not connecting me to Him.

So I decided to discard the Islamic rituals, in favor of simply trying to be a good person and focusing on my studies.

I decided I wanted to be a scientist. I dreamed of going to the United States of America to pursue graduate studies. I hoped to earn a Ph.D. in science and then become a research scientist at one of the top research centers.

I worked hard and became the top student in my class at Kharazmi High School. Then I was admitted to the region’s top technical school, Aryamehr University, which is now named Sharif University of Technology. (Incidentally, “Aryamehr” means “lover of the Aryan race,” and it was one of the Shah’s nicknames. The school was renamed after the revolution. Sharif Vaghefi was one of the martyrs killed during the revolution.)

“DEATH TO SHAH, DEATH TO AMERICA!”

While in college, I met Donnell, this brave American girl from Oregon who had moved to Tehran and was working at DuPont, the well-known global science company. Donnell was a nominal

Christian, and when we decided to get married, she converted to Islam.

She was touched by the devotion of Muslims. She admired their focus on their faith and their families. When she compared Islam to the lukewarm Christianity she saw in her church, she was drawn to Islam. Of course, she needed to convert to marry me, but her devotion to the faith was real. We were married in Tehran on October 23, 1977.

In 1978, I finished my last semester at technical school—and not a moment too soon. That summer, turmoil erupted on the streets of Tehran, and the demonstrations forced my school to shut down.

I should note that I was not a leader but an active participant in the protests. I supported the effort, because that’s what all my peers were doing.

For the four years I was on campus, I shared this mind-set with my fellow students: “We need do something for the good of our country because the Shah of Iran is corrupt.”

It wasn’t about politics; it was about our genuine love for our nation. Plus, it was our job as students to oppose *something!*

On September 8, 1978, (a day that became known as Black Friday), the Shah’s army opened fire on a group of protesters, killing and wounding hundreds.

My new wife faced death during this season of protest. Twice.

During a street demonstration outside her job at DuPont, Donnell heard bullets crash through her window and ricochet off a wall. Some of those bullets barely missed her head. Later, slugs were found in the trash bin near her desk.

Weeks later, her life was spared again. A few minutes after she finished dining in a restaurant in Tehran’s Argentina Square, a bomb exploded, killing many diners.

The protests and violence continued through the fall of 1978.

I faced a dilemma. I wanted to be on the streets, supporting the demonstrations. But I knew that I could be shot and killed as a result. Eventually, my sense of duty to my country overcame my fears. Donnell and I decided to join the demonstrators, despite the danger.

It's important to note that the revolution began with students and other young people. Eventually, the oil workers joined effort, going on strike, as did some government employees.

When it looked like we might actually topple the powerful Shah and bring in a democratic government, more older men joined.

However, most of the protesters were brave young men and women who protested peacefully.

By December 1978, the Shah decided to stop responding violently to the demonstrators. This caused our resistance to grow in numbers, and in boldness. Various factions of the resistance began to unite and organize.

In the beginning, this revolutionary movement was not Islamic at all. There were many opposition groups, including the intellectuals (mostly university students and graduates), the mujahideen (a militant Islamic group), the Fadaian (a militant/terrorist Marxist group that had been trying to topple the government for 25 years), the Tudeh Party (a communist group), and several other Islamic groups, some liberal and conservative.

These disparate groups had differing philosophies and beliefs, but they all knew that they would need to find some common ground and purpose if they wanted to bring down the Shah, who was backed by the United States. The biggest question was *how* to bring him down.

Eventually, the resistance found common ground in the Islamic faith. Even the intellectuals like me (who didn't practice the faith in

our daily lives) held positive feelings about Islam. We believed that Islam was a good religion, even if it wasn't our personal religion.

Thus, Islam became the revolution's focal point. Soon, a rather obscure Islamic leader named Ruhollah Khomeini became the face of the revolution. (Americans came to know this man as Ayatollah Khomeini.)

Khomeini had been exiled by the Shah in 1964, and he was living in Paris, France, when the revolution erupted. He accepted the role as “leader of the opposition.”

He met with the leaders of all the opposition groups—even the atheists—assuring them that he had no desire to lead Iran after the revolution succeeded. When the Shah was gone, Khomeini promised to step aside and let Iran be governed democratically. This promise pleased everyone in the resistance, so Khomeini received a promise of full support.

This sudden unity shocked the Shah's regime. It also shocked President Jimmy Carter and his administration. American leadership didn't realize just how unpopular the Shah was. And no one expected the Shah to face such a large and unified movement.

When President Carter and his team saw millions of people protesting, the United States withdrew its support of the Shah. They encouraged (or perhaps forced) the Shah to step down and leave the country—before Iran suffered any more bloodshed.

The Shah had become so unpopular that even the students and other intellectuals became militant. Donnell was so shaken by the two violent attacks she experienced that she donned the chador (an Islamic cloak) and joined me on Tehran's streets, shouting, “Death to Shah. Death to America!” with the rest of the mobs.

However, while my lips were proclaiming death to the United States, in my heart I was pleading, “But not yet. I want to get my Ph.D. from a good American university!”

Indeed, this was a time of profound internal conflict for me. It was my dream to attend school in America, but I knew I would hate myself if I sat at home and failed to join the other university students in their heartfelt protests. I didn't want to be disloyal to my country. But I also didn't want to get killed while protesting. I should add here that today my wife and I joyfully sing "God Bless America." Those days of anti-America sentiments are long gone.

The Shah left Iran in January of 1979, and we all felt that our troubles were behind us. The opposition unified under Khomeini, and we expected Iran to become a democratic country in short order.

I hoped to resume my plans of earning a doctoral degree from an American university and becoming a research scientist.

I had applied to and was admitted to the University of Southern California (USC). In late January of 1979, Donnell and I left the chaos of Iran to build a better life for ourselves, to pursue the American dream.

WHAT WERE YOUR CHILDHOOD DREAMS?

I am not and have never been a fan of empty rituals, which bring no personal benefit. If you practice something over and over and it doesn't change you, maybe you are searching for truth and meaning in the wrong place.

I had a dream from childhood that God would use me to do something great through science to impact people's lives. It was a God-given vision and He directed me to fulfill that vision in a better way--through the sharing of His Gospel.

What about you? What were you passionate about when you were younger? Have you given up on those dreams? Have they withered and died within you?

Often our passions, our dreams, are from God. They reflect how God has designed you and me and what He wants from our lives.

Now, you might say, “I don’t think much about my childhood dreams because I wasn’t a believer back then. However, while you might not have known God, He knew you. He called you even before you were born. (See Jeremiah 1:5 and Ephesians 2:10.)

Take time to review those childhood dreams with God right now.

Pray, “Dear Lord, I had dreams in my youth that are now forgotten and buried under the burdens of this life. Were they truly from You? Did You design me for them? If so, please resurrect them in my heart and enable me to pursue them with Your strength and direction, and for Your glory.”

When Donnell and I came to America, we were starving for change. We dreamed of making a better life for ourselves. We pursued that goal the best way we knew how—through education and being open-minded.

What about you? Are you hungry for change? Are you open to new spiritual truths? No matter how hard your life may have been as a child or how many miles you have traveled to get where you are now, I want you to know that you are not alone. We all have unique paths to walk, but there are universal truths we can rely on throughout our journeys.

I know that my life is a bit radical. Most people reading this book have never shouted “Death to Shah, Death to America” on the streets of Tehran.

But I know that many of us feel embarrassed by certain parts of our life stories. Please don’t hide any part of your story, for it makes you who you are today.

I share my story (the good, the bad, and the embarrassing), because I value truth. I left my family in Iran to begin a new search for truth and a better life for Donnell and me.

I believe your life is unique and your story is worth sharing: the good, bad, and the embarrassing.

At the end of this book, I will share questions for you to reflect on, questions connected to each chapter.

As a research scientist by trade (and by passion), I believe God has so much more for you and for me if we are willing and open-minded enough to reflect, study, and research.

Psalm 32:8 assures us, “I will instruct you and teach you in the way which you should go; I will counsel you with My eye upon you.” This verse has always held deep meaning for me, because it gives me the warmest feeling that God is my father.

My earthly father was not involved in my life at all. He was very distant. As a middle child in a large family, I was mostly ignored. I was encouraged to be “the quiet child,” to study hard and avoid causing any trouble.

As a result, I felt like I grew up without a father. I always wanted a male presence in my life, a father figure who would teach me how to live and give me wisdom to make the right decisions and have the right attitude.

That never happened, but it didn't stop me from pursuing my dreams, living my life, and learning from good books—as well as from my mistakes.

Eventually, I found the best book in the world (the Bible) and the best father (God). God has never left me. He has always guided me, even in the worst crises and most heart-wrenching decisions of my life.
